



ie = ie + ying




die = dying lie = lying tie = tying




PRESENT SIMPLE

PRESENT SIMPLE

Añade -s, -es, -ies al final de los verbos cuando se conjuguen con he, she, it.





EXCEPCIONES

Añade <u>-es</u> a los verbos terminados en <u>-o</u>, <u>-sh</u>, <u>-ch</u>, <u>-ss</u>, <u>-x</u>, <u>-z</u>.

To do	He do <u>es</u>
To fish	She fish <u>es</u>
To teach	He teach <u>es</u>
To express	She express <u>es</u>
To relax	He relax <u>es</u>

Añade -ies a los verbos terminados en consonante + y.

To study	He stud <u>ies</u>
To notify	She notifies

Añade -s a los verbos terminados en vocal + y

To buy	He buys
To enjoy	She enjoys




NEGATIVE FORM

Do is an auxiliary that is used to negate verbs.





STRUCTURE (NEGATIVE)



I don't study English

He doesn't do exercise

They don't like pizza

It doesn't play with its ball

We don't have three books
