
PRESENT SIMPLE

Present simple

Add **-s**, **-es**, **-ies** to the end of verbs conjugating with he, she, it.





Spelling rules

Add -es to verbs ending in –o, -sh, -ch, -ss, -x, -z.

To d o	He d o<u>es</u>
To fi sh	She fi sh<u>es</u>
To tea ch	He tea ch<u>es</u>
To expre ss	She expre ss<u>es</u>
To rela x	He rela x<u>es</u>
To bu zz	She bu zz<u>es</u>

Add -ies to verbs ending in -y (as a vowel letter).


To stud y	He stud <u>ies</u>
To notif y	She notif <u>ies</u>


Add –s to verbs ending in –y (as a consonant letter).

To bu y	He bu y<u>s</u>
To enjo y	She enjo y<u>s</u>




