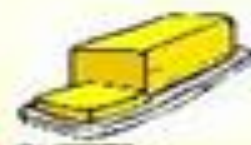

COUNTABLE NOUNS

I eat a **banana** every day.

I like **bananas**.

➔ “banana” is a countable noun.
“plátano es un sustantivo contable”

CO_UNTABLE NOUNS

✓ *A countable noun can be*

1. *singular (**banana**) or*

2. *plural (**bananas**)*

✓ **Countable nouns** *son aquellos sustantivos que se pueden contar*

✓ *So we can say 'one banana', 'two bananas' etc.*

✓ *Podemos decir 'una banana', 'dos bananas'*

Examples of **countable** nouns

singular

- ✓ **apple**
- ✓ **pineapple**
- ✓ **cucumber**
- ✓ **strawberry**
- ✓ **grape**

plural

- apples**
- pineapples**
- cucumbers**
- strawberries**
- grapes**

CO_UNTABLE NOUNS

We add **-es** to most nouns in **-o**:

Si finaliza en **-o** agregamos **-es**

✓ tomato tomatoes

✓ potato potatoes

But we just add **-s** to: **(excepción)**

✓ radio radios

✓ photo photos

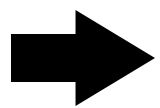

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

I eat **rice** every day.

I like **rice** and **cereal**.



“**rice**” is an uncountable noun.

“cereal” is uncountable too.

“Arroz es un sustantivo no-contable”

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

- ✓ An uncountable noun has only one form. (*rice*)
- ✓ Solo tiene una forma.

Correcto: arroz

Incorrecto: arroces

- ✓ Uncountable nouns are things we *cannot* count.
- ✓ **No** Podemos *contar* estos sustantivos.

Incorrecto: un arroz, dos arroces

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Examples of uncountable nouns:

- ✓ Ink
- ✓ Lettuce
- ✓ Sugar
- ✓ Water
- ✓ Milk
- ✓ *Etc.*

SOME – ANY – NO – A LOT OF

SOME

*Cuando la cantidad es incierta

*Oraciones positivas.

*Para preguntas de invitacion.

e.g.

I have **some** friends.

The children have **some** free time.

Please buy **some** bananas.

Would you like **some** cake?

SOME – ANY – NO – A LOT OF

ANY

- * Oraciones negativas.
- * Para hacer preguntas.

e.g.

Do you have **any** friends in Australia?

They don't have **any** money today.

My brother never does **any** bad things.

SOME – ANY – **NO** – A LOT OF

NO

*Oraciones positivas com significado negativo.

El no va después del auxiliar

e.g.

There is **no** coffee left in the coffee pot.

We have **no** milk for breakfast.

They have **no** family in London.

SOME – ANY – NO – A LOT OF

A LOT OF

***Substituye MANY & MUCH**

***Oraciones positivas, negativas y preguntas.**

e.g.

Look! There are **a lot of** dogs in the street today.

I have **a lot of** time to answer your questions.

There are **a lot of** people in the concert.

Do you have **a lot of** fun when you watch films?
