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TYPES OF WEATHER

CLOUDY

when the sky is covered with clouds, it is said to be cloudy. This frequent condition is known as cloudiness and implies that the sun appears hidden from the view of an observer. It should be remembered that a cloud is made up of water droplets or snow crystals found in the atmosphere.



RAIN

They are climates with temperatures of the coldest month above 18° C. They are located in areas that extend from Ecuador to the Tropics at altitudes below about 800 to 1000 m, with rainfall over 750 mm annually, they are also called megathermal climates or warm with forests.



SUNNY

it is the climate in which there is no presence of many clouds and therefore the sunlight is very intense.



CYCLONE

It usually refers to intense winds accompanied by a storm, although it also designates the areas of the planet in which the atmospheric pressure is low.



DAMP

The humid continental climate is the continental climate that presents rainfall throughout the year; in summer there are rains that can appear in the form of storms and in winter snowfall occurs.
