Negation of an obligation or advice can be expressed with **should not** or with its contraction **shouldn't.**

It has already been mentioned that **should** can be understood as a **moral obligation**, or convenience in doing something, or as the probability of doing something or of something happening.






A question about an obligation or advice can be expressed by writing **should** before the subject of the sentence.

It is usually used to ask someone or to ask for advice, so the "do do you think" is used: do you think + subject + should + verb + complement +? Should + subject + verb + complement +?
