


Can means power.

The negative of **can** is **cannot**, whose abbreviated version is **can't**.

It refers to the ability and possibility of performing an action, as well as the possibility of a certain event occurring.

For this reason, the words can and can't tend to be accompanied by another verb (what can or cannot be done). In Spanish, "can" can be translated on many occasions as "know", in the sense of knowing how to do something.




