The theory

The perfect present in negative is formed by adding not a <u>have</u> (or <u>has</u> if it is the third person singular). The vast majority of the time we contract the negations when speaking, so it is like this:

Third Person

He She It Jaime doesn't **have to** wash his car on Saturday

Maria doesn't **have to** go to the market every day

It's not raining, you don't **have to** take an umbrella

My dog doesn't have to eat today

She doesn't **have to** buy new clothes, she has many new dresses

He doesn't **have to** catch the bus in the morning.

You We They

You don't **have to** tell me what I already know

They don't **have to** go to the party, if they don't want to

we don't **have to** send the plans next week

My dog doesn't **have to** eat today

I don't **have to** work this fortnight

I don't **have to** go to Europe out of obligation
