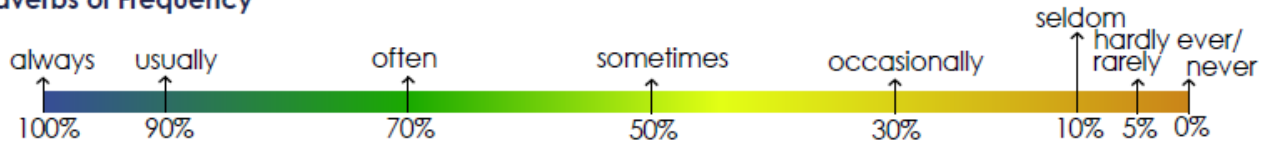

Adverbs of Frequency



Adverbs of frequency go after "be" but before other verbs.

Example: I'm always tired on Sundays.

Example: I usually watch sport on TV.

Always: Siempre

Usually: Usualmente

Often: Frecuentemente

Sometimes: Algunas veces

Occasionally: Ocasionalmente

Seldom: Pocas veces

Hardly ever / rarely: Raramente

Never: Nunca

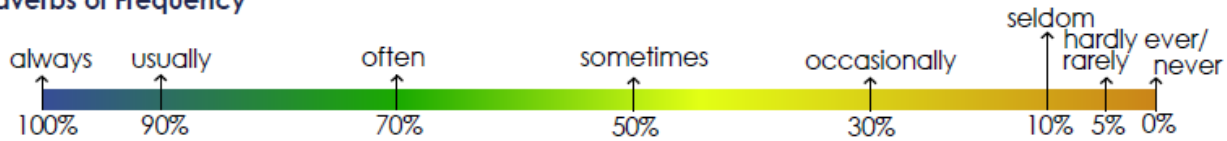
