Be going to

Be going to: Forms

Afirmative: Subject + to be verb + going to + infinitive verb + complement

Example: I am going to eat tacos

Negative: Subject + to be verb + not + going to + infinitive verb + complement

Example: I am not going to eat tacos

Question: To be verb + subject + going to + infinitive verb + complement + ?

Example: Are you going to eat tacos?

When we use “Be going to”

Be going to is commonly used in informal styles

Intentions: We use be going to to talk about future plans and intentions. Usually the decision about the future plans has already been made:

Example: I’m going to look for a new place to live next month.

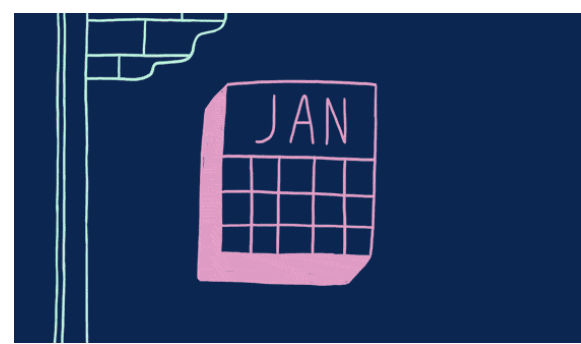
Predictions: We use be going to to predict something that we think is certain to happen or which we have evidence for now:

Example: Look out! He’s going to break that glass.

Commands: We use be going to when we give commands or state that something is obligatory

Example: You’re going to pick up all of those toys right now. This room is a mess!
