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GIVING DIRECTIONS

When it comes to knowing and giving directions it is very important in the hospital, it may seem insignificant, but good communication and using the correct propositions are essential, through it you have the facility to teach the correct path, at the same time you help so that the interested party who wants to reach a certain point can save time.

In a hospital this happens day by day, therefore, it should not be forgotten to use the keywords such as: next to, in front of, next corridor, you turn left or right, among many other words to use, for this reason During this writing some examples of it are presented, at the same time it is expressed as a mini sketch of a hospital.

As often happens, people always come asking where their relative is and how to get to him, in the following example it is expressed how a wife asks for directions to get to the room where her husband who had an accident is.

-Excuse me miss, my husband has just been rushed to hospital since he was in a car accident. Could you please tell me where he is? His name is Anderson Smith.

-Of course, miss: your husband is hospitalized up the stairs on the fourth floor of the hospital, but to get there follow the signs.

-First go straight down the hall until you find a sign that says oncology, from there you turn right, walk straight and in front are the stairs that take you to the second floor, go up the stairs and when you are up you will find three directions, the left that takes you to the X-ray area, the corridor that continues straight leads you to the physiotherapy area, but you will go to the right, walk until you find the Pharmacy section, in front of the pharmacy there is a corridor that takes you to the next stairs, you will take that straight path, and upon arrival go up the stairs and just then you will be on the third floor of the hospital.

-The third floor is similar to the second, but this time you turn left, go through the first two doors and turn left, there you will see a cafeteria, in front of the cafeteria there is a corridor, after the corridor you will see a sign that says maternity, later you will find an infusion room, in front there are some stairs, you take the stairs and from there go up to the fourth floor where your husband is.

- There is another option to get there, if you do not want to walk as much you can take the elevator at the end of the corridor, and when you are on the fourth floor, you will find other nurses, give your husband's name and they will tell you where to wait or some other information from him.

Through the example you can see how to give direction to get to a place, whether short or long, it will always be up to the instructor to make the path short or long.
