1. Complete the sentences with **to be going to** and the verbs in brackets:

Example: We are going to cook (cook) dinner this evening.

- Next summer, I'm going to travel (travel) to England.
- My sister Maria going to live (live) in Madrid.
- They're going to play (play) tennis this afternoon.

Is your grandparents going to visit you next weekend? - No, your grandparents isn't going to visit you next weekend.
