

"Can" / "can`t" and "have to" / "don`t have to"								
Can - We use "can" + the base form of a verb for possibility. Example: We can stay out late tonight. There are no classes tomorrow morning.								
- Questions Can you go running tomorrow at 3:00? (Yes, I can / No, I can't).								
- "Can" is invariable. Example: Can she play tennis? Yes, she can.								
Can't - We use "can't" + the base form of a verb for impossibility. Example: I can't stay out late tonight. I have class tomorrow morning.								
Have to - We use "have to" or "has to" + the base form of a verb for obligation.								
I have to work / don't have to We \ have to work / don't have to								
You have to work / don't have to You have to work / don't have to								
He They have to work / don't have to								
She								
"Don't" / "doesn't have to"								
- We use "don't" / "doesn't have to" + the base form of a verb when it's not necessary to do something.								
Example: We don't have to go to school tomorrow because it's Sunday.
