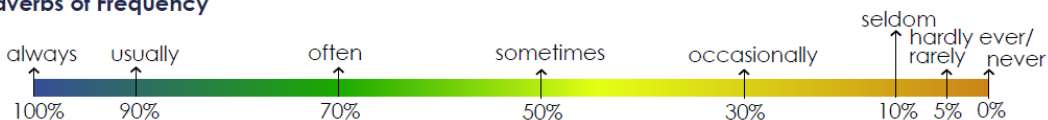

Adverbs of Frequency

Example: I usually watch sport on TV.

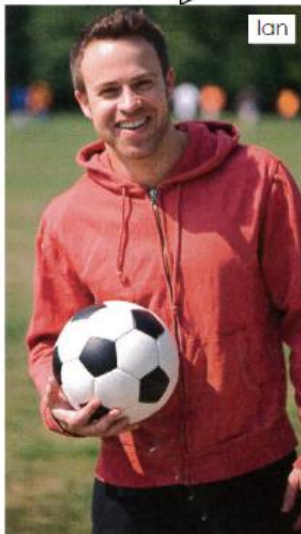
