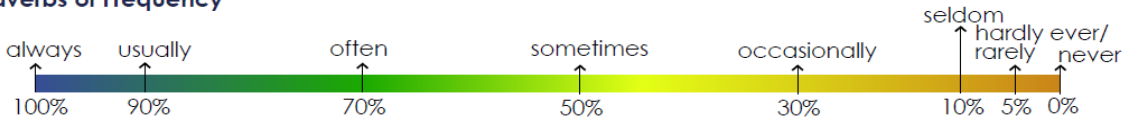

Adverbs of Frequency



Adverbs of frequency go after "be" but before other verbs.

Example: I'm always tired on Sundays.

Example: I usually watch sport on TV.

I USUALLY GET UP AT SEVEN O'CLOCK
