Koreans officially follow the Gregorian calendar, only some holidays are based on the lunar calendar. On official holidays, offices and banks are closed, but palaces, museums, most restaurants, department stores, and entertainment venues are open.

Seollal and Chuseok are the most important traditional festivals in Korea. Millions of people visit their hometowns to celebrate these dates together with their families. In Seollal, Koreans celebrate a memorial service for their ancestors and perform the sebae (a formal bow of respect for their elders) as a New Year's greeting.

New Year's Day (January 1)

1. Bukchon Hanok Village

Bukchon Hanok Village provides travelers with a unique insight into what life in this part of the world may have been like hundreds of years ago. About 900 traditional Korean houses, or hanoks, line the narrow streets, whose roots go back to the Joseon dynasty some 600 years ago. Bukchon Hanok Village is sandwiched between the majestic

Gyeongbokgung-Palace and the Changdeokgung-Palace, enhancing the rustic charm of the attraction.

2. Changdeokgung

The Changdeokgung-Palace is the second oldest royal palace in Seoul: the Gyeongbokgung-Palace surpasses it by 20 years. It is the best preserved of the five royal palaces in Seoul and is considered a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. The palace grounds consist of a public tourism area, a residential building designed for the royal family, and a large lush garden known as the Huwon Secret Garden. The spectacular presence of Mount Bugaksan behind the Changdeokgung-Palace makes this attraction one of the most impressive places in the city.
