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# Demonstratives Pronouns "one" and "ones" and Demonstratives

These

Affirmative form - Forma afirmativa: These + are + green pants.  
Negative form – Forma negativa: These + are + not green pants.  
Question form – Forma interrogativa: Are + these + green pants?

Those

Affirmative form - Forma afirmativa: Those + are + cotton sweaters  
Negative form – Forma negativa: Those + are + not cotton sweaters  
Question form – Forma interrogativa: Are + those + vinyl wallets?

ONE y ONES como pronombre demostrativo

One and ones are pronouns because they go instead of the noun either in singular and plural, this noun has to have been mentioned before, to know what refers. As such they do not have any meaning in Spanish, as long as are used as pronouns.

When we use it in question we use Which one? Not only which, since we have previously identified the object to which we refer, if not, we would have to mention the object. Which book? Which car? Which house do you mean? - What book? Which one car? What house do you mean? If we already know what object is being talked about, we say: Which one?

Which dress do you prefer? The blue one (the blue dress) - Which dress do you prefer? The blue (the blue dress).

Those are chocolate chip cookies? Which?
