Indefinite article and Prepositions of place .

Definite article.

- Is a type of article that modifies a noun and Indicates that it is known to the speaker.
- The number of forms of the given article Varies according to the language

It also has a neutral form "Lo", which is used to accompany adjectives, adverbs, possessive pronouns or participles to transform it into abstract nouns.

Example:

- The important thing is to get the job done on time.
- It is impressive how well he speaks Spanish.

Child of definite articles.

- He... el
- The... la
- The... los
- The... las
- The... lo



Indefinite articles.

The are two singular indefinite articles in english(a, an) that function like the two spanish forms (un, una).

In english, as in spanish the indefinite article refers to an unspecified thing.

Example of statements that shows.

- I bought a car – compré un coche.
- She saw an elephant- vio a un elefante.
- They have an idea- tiene una idea.

In general, the indefinite article "a" is used in front of a noun (noun) that begins with a consonant

The indefinite article is still used in front of a noun that begins with a vowel.

Prepositions of place.

We call prepositions of place to those expressions that determine the position of an object or person.

These prepositions are located just after the main verb or action, of the sentence.

How do they work.

In – en, dentro de

We use it when the object or subject is in a three- dimensional space, in a country or city.



Below – debajo de.

We use it when the subject or object is under another subject or object, but there is no physical contact between them.



Under – debajo de.

Use under when you see that there is physical contact between both objects or subjects.



Over – por encima de, encima de, sobre.

It is used to indicate that something is immediately above an object.

On – sobre, encima de.

This pronoun is used when an object or subject is on a straight surface.



In front of - delante de.

This preposition is useful to express that the object or subject is located in front of another subject or object.

Between – en medio de, entre.

It tells us when a subject or object is in the middle of two or more subjects or objects.
