A common noun names a general person, place or thing.

examples:

I went to the city.

The man was kind.

A *proper noun* names a specific person, place, or thing. Always capitalize the first letter of a proper noun.

examples: I went to San Francisco.

Mr. Brown was kind.

My new puppy, Perro, is playful.
