## Affirmative

It takes three forms: is, are, am that will accompany the personal pronouns of English: I with am; he, she, it with is, and we, you, they with are.

I am.....

## Negative

To make the negative, just add not after the form of the verb be

I am not.....  
You are not.....  
He is not.....  
She is not.....  
It is not.....  
We are not.....  
You are not.....  
They are not.....

## Interrogative

The order of the sentence varies and the form of the verb be is placed before the subject of the sentence.

Am i.....?  
Are you.....?  
Is he.....?  
Is it.....?  
Are we.....?  
Are you.....?  
Are they.....?
