THE USE OF THE "CAN AND CAN'T"

The verb can is a modal verb that in Spanish means "power", this verb is also used to express ability, to say that something is possible or impossible, to ask permission and offer things.

Gramatical rules

When we write its infinitive it is NOT preceded by TO like the other verbs.

It does not take into account the "s" in the third person singular in the present tense (he, she, it).

The verb that follows always goes in the infinitive, that is, WITHOUT the TO.

It is used for both the affirmative and the interrogative and WITHOUT auxiliary

Example

Affirmative sentences with "Can"

Pronoun / name + can + action verb + Complement

- ✓ He can work today.
- He can works today.
- ✓ She can wash the dishes.
- She can washes the dishes

Negative sentences with "Can't"

Pronoun / name + can't + action verb + Complement

- ✓ He can't work today
- ✓ She can't wash the dishes

Interrogative Sentences with "Can"

Can + Pronoun / name + action verb + Complement?

- ✓ Can he work today?
- ✓ Can she wash the dishes?
