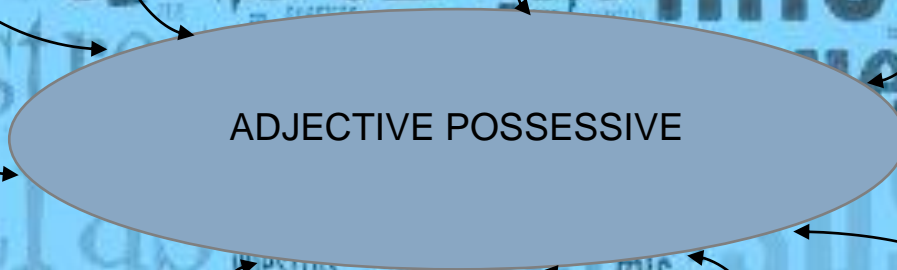
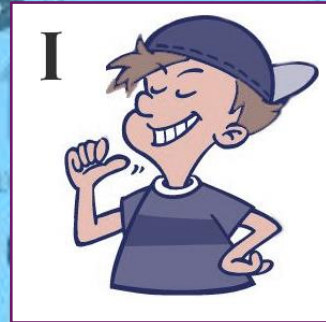
- The photography is what he loves
