Demonstrative pronouns (this, that, that one) are the words that replace and determine nouns, indicating where something or someone is in space and time in relation to the speaker and/or the listener.

## Examples

- This one is convenient
- That's very cheap.
- That one is very comfortable

DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS

Relationship to gender and number

Demonstrative pronouns must match the gender (male, female, or neutral) and the number (plural or singular) in reference to what is noted.

The object (person, situation, noun) to which these pronouns refer can be considered in space and time

Demonstrative pronoun time

this, this and this point to the present.

that, that and that point to the past or the future.

## Examples

- Yesterday was a grueling day; let's hope this one is more relaxed.
- Summer is high, I hope it's like the one we all get together in.
