# DEMONSTRATIVES PRONOUNS

Demonstrative pronouns are words that are used to refer to a subject without having to mention it. These pronouns allow to indicate distance or closeness with respect to the emitter. For example: that, this, that.

These pronouns can indicate items in space or time, and they can be either singular or plural

## EXAMPLES

**THIS:**  
1.- This was my mother's ring  
2.- This car is dirty.

**THAT:**  
1.- That looks like the car I used to drive.  
2.- That is your wallet

**THESE:**  
1.- These are nice shoes, but they look uncomfortable.  
2.- These are my Math books.

**THOSE:**  
1.- Those look like riper than the apples on my tree.  
2.- Those are old houses.
