

Possessive Pronouns

Possessive pronouns are those pronouns that indicate the property of something for some person. The pronoun replaces the name and in this case the noun, it expresses the property of something.

Singular pronouns

The singular is the variant of the number that indicates a single element of the referent of a word or expression. Contrast with the plural and sometimes with the dual or other variants of the grammatical number.

Examples

1. My pencil is the newest
2. I do not share my tasks with anyone
3. My uncles spoil me more
4. your heart belongs to me

Plural pronouns

The plural is a grammatical number that normally refers to two or more people or things, although it is also used with the number zero or numbers with decimal places.

Examples

5. Our students behave very well in schools
6. The work is already ours.
7. The new pants are ours.
8. She is our new English teacher
