SUJE

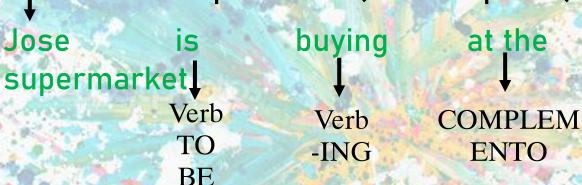

El presente continuo es un tiempo verbal, que se utiliza para expresar acciones que están sucediendo o que suceden ahora mismo (now, at the moment).

La principal característica de este tiempo verbal es el uso del gerundio "-ing", que en español puede traducirse como los gerundios "-ando" y "-endo".

ESTRUCTURA

Sujeto + verb TO BE + Verbo terminando en -ING + complemento (si se requiere).



AFIRMATIVE

- 1.- She is sleeping in her bedroom.
- 2.- It is snowing right now!
- 3.- They are speaking Italian.
- 4.- He is walking his dog.
- 5.- They are buying a new car.
- 6.- The taxi is stopping in that corner.

NEGATIVE
