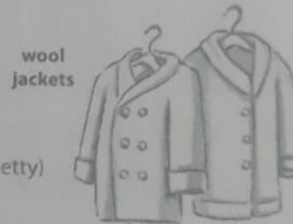
1. A: These cotton gloves are nice.
