#### Verb to be (plural)

##### AFFIRMATIVE (+)

we`re (= we are)	We`re in a small hotel.
you`re (= you are)	You`re from the UK.
they`re (= they are)	They`re very big.

##### NEGATIVE (-)

we aren`t (= are not)	We aren`t in the hotel now.
you aren`t (= are not)	You aren`t from Turkey.
they aren`t (= are not)	They aren`t very expensive.

##### YES/NO QUESTIONS (?)

##### SHORT ANSWER

Are we in room 216?	Yes, you are. No, you aren`t.
Are you in London?	Yes, we are. No, we aren`t.
Are they in a big hotel?	Yes, they are. No, they aren`t.
