SUPER NOTE ON PREPOSITIONS OF PLACE AS THEY USUALLY ARE: IN, IN THE CORNER OF, IN FRONT OF, NEXT TO AND BETWEEN WITH 5 EXAMPLES EACH.

A preposition is a word that serves to establish a relationship between the subject of a sentence with complements or relating it to another noun, although by themselves they do not make sense, since when relating the parts of the sentence they provide the sense of the relationship between the subject and the complements that it connects, this is how a preposition of a place shows the location or position of something related to something else, so that when a preposition contains more than one word, it is known as a prepositional phrase so that they act as a preposition composed of several terms, instead of just one, this is how we can say that many of the prepositions of place are also used as prepositions of mode or movement, their function being differentiated by the context in which they are used, so that the most used prepositions are; on, on the corner of, across from, next to and between, which then 5 examples of each will be given, as well as by;

For example, prepositions of on are usually:

1. Where is my lens? It is on your head.
2. Where is my watch? It is on your bed.
3. Where is the control? It is on the room.
4. Where is my pants? It is on your closet.
5. Where is my jelly? It is on the fridge.

For example, the prepositions of on the corner of are usually:

1. Where is the market? It is on the corner of the elementary school.
2. Where is the cyber? It is on the corner of Don Eugenio's house.
3. Where is the bakery? It is on the corner of Don Silverio's house.
4. Where is the phone booth? It is on the corner of the tortillería.
5. Where is the vet? It is on the corner of the corregidora.

For example, the prepositions of across from are usually:

1. Where is the taxi place? It is across front Palace.
2. Where is the taqueria? It is across front national park.
3. Where is the stationery? It is across front shoe store.
4. Where is the pastry shop? It is across front pharmacy.
5. Where is the pharmacy? It is across front hostel.

For example, the prepositions next to are usually:

1. Where is my headset? It is next to the speaker.
2. Where is the car? It is next to the house.
3. Where is my slipper? It is next to your desk.
4. Where is the printer? It is next to the bookseller.
5. Where is the trash? It is next to moon shoe store.

For example, the prepositions between are usually:

1. Where is the cafeteria? It is between the ejidal house and ice cream shop.
2. Where are the dogs? It is between the house and the neighbour's.
3. Where is the basketball court? It is between the church and the market.
4. Where is the nursery? It is between the College and high school.
5. Where is the washing machine? It is between the door and bathroom.
