VERB SENTENCES TO BE WITH ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

FREQUENCY ADVERBS

Expresan la periodicidad con la que se realiza una acción. Se escriben antes del verbo principal de una oración, excepto cuando el verbo principal es el verbo to be: You always come to class late. (Tú siempre llegas a clase tarde)

VERBO TO BE

Significa en español "ser" o "estar". Por ello, para su correcta comprensión, se debe entender el contexto de la oración en la que es utilizado. Es irregular, lo que quiere decir que, dependiendo del pronombre personal (sujeto) que lo acompañe, se conjuga de diferentes maneras. Además, este verbo también presenta variaciones en los tiempos verbales de presente, pasado y futuro simple.
