**\*Adverbs of quantity** with count and uncountable nouns: *too many, too much, fewer, less, more.*

<p>We use <b>much</b> + uncountable noun: <b>much water / much noise</b> etc.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Did you have <b>much money</b>?</li><li>• We don't drink <b>much</b> coke.</li><li>• Do you have any lemonade?</li></ul> <p>I have some but <b>not much</b>.</p>	<p>We use <b>many</b> + plural noun: <b>many friends / many people</b> etc.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Did you have <b>many books</b>?</li><li>• I don't have <b>many friends</b>.</li><li>• Did you take any <b>photographs</b>?</li></ul> <p>I took some but not <b>many</b></p>
<p>We use <b>a lot of</b> + <i>all types of</i> noun:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We bought <b>a lot of cheese</b></li><li>• Max doesn't have <b>a lot of money</b></li></ul> <p>Note that we say: There <b>is</b> a lot of <b>mayonnaise/ bread/tea...</b> (singular verb)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• We needed <b>a lot of eggs</b>.</li><li>• Did they buy a <b>lot of cookies</b>.</li></ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• There <b>are</b> a lot <b>sandwiches/ apples / houses...</b> (plural verb)</li></ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A lot of <b>people like</b> coke. (not 'likes')</li></ul>
