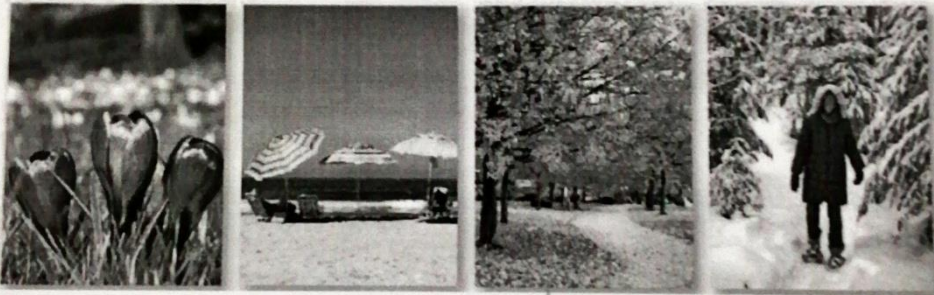

1 The future with *be going to*

- ▶ Use *am/is/are + going to + base form* for the future: We're **going to stay** home tonight.
- ▶ In questions with *be going to*, the *be* verb comes before the noun or pronoun: **Is he going to bake** me a cake?
