
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The verb "to have" is the second most used verb in English, and its uses are quite important. Learn to use this verb in English in a simple and natural way.

In the English language there are mainly two uses of the verb "to have": First, when it acts as the main verb of the sentence, and second, when it is used as an auxiliary verb. Additionally, this verb has a third use in English as a modal verb, in which case it is used to express obligation or need and its equivalent in Spanish may change.

HAVE/HAS

Use the verb have/has to describe parts of the face
When we describe someone's hair, eyes, or parts of the
face, we can use the verb have/has:

- I have short, wavy, brown hair.
  - He has big blue eyes.
  - She has long eyelashes.
- My father has a beard and a mustache.

## Examples of the have.

#### **Affirmative**

- You have beautiful eyes!
- My brother and I have a beard and a mustache.
- My parents have gray hair.

### **Negative**

- I don't have blue eyes.
- You don't have red hair.
- We don't have thick eyebrows.

#### **Interrogative**

- Do you have blond hair?
- Do they have small eyes?
- Do your brother and sister have long ears?

#### Examples of the verb has.

#### **Affirmative**

- Pablo has a big nose.
- Your mom has big green eyes.
- The dog has black and brown hair.

# **Negative**

- Pablo doesn't have a beard.
- Your friend doesn't have curly hair.
- The dog doesn't have a long tail.

# Interrogative

- Does the baby have wavy hair?
- Does your boyfriend have a mustache?
