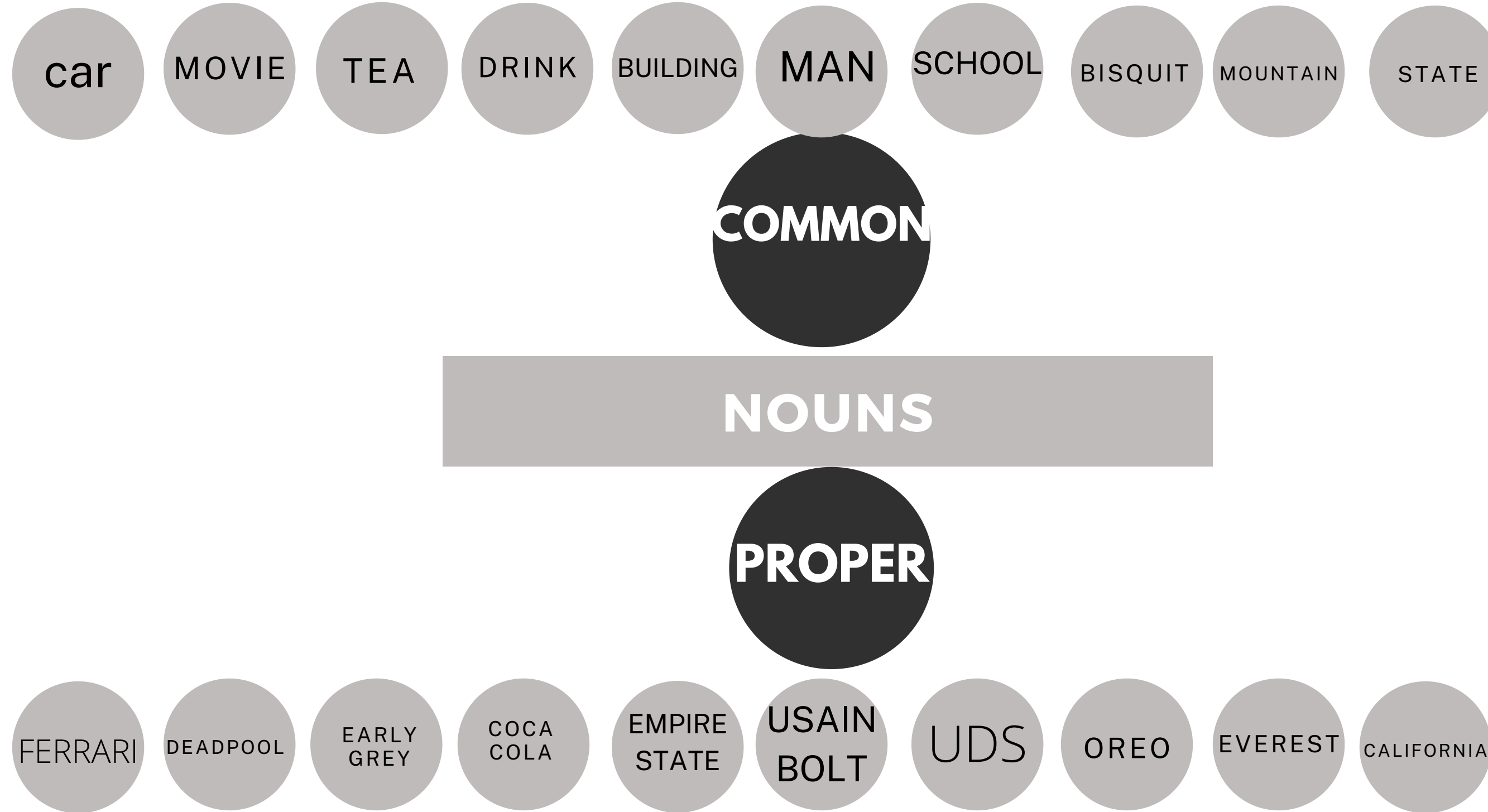

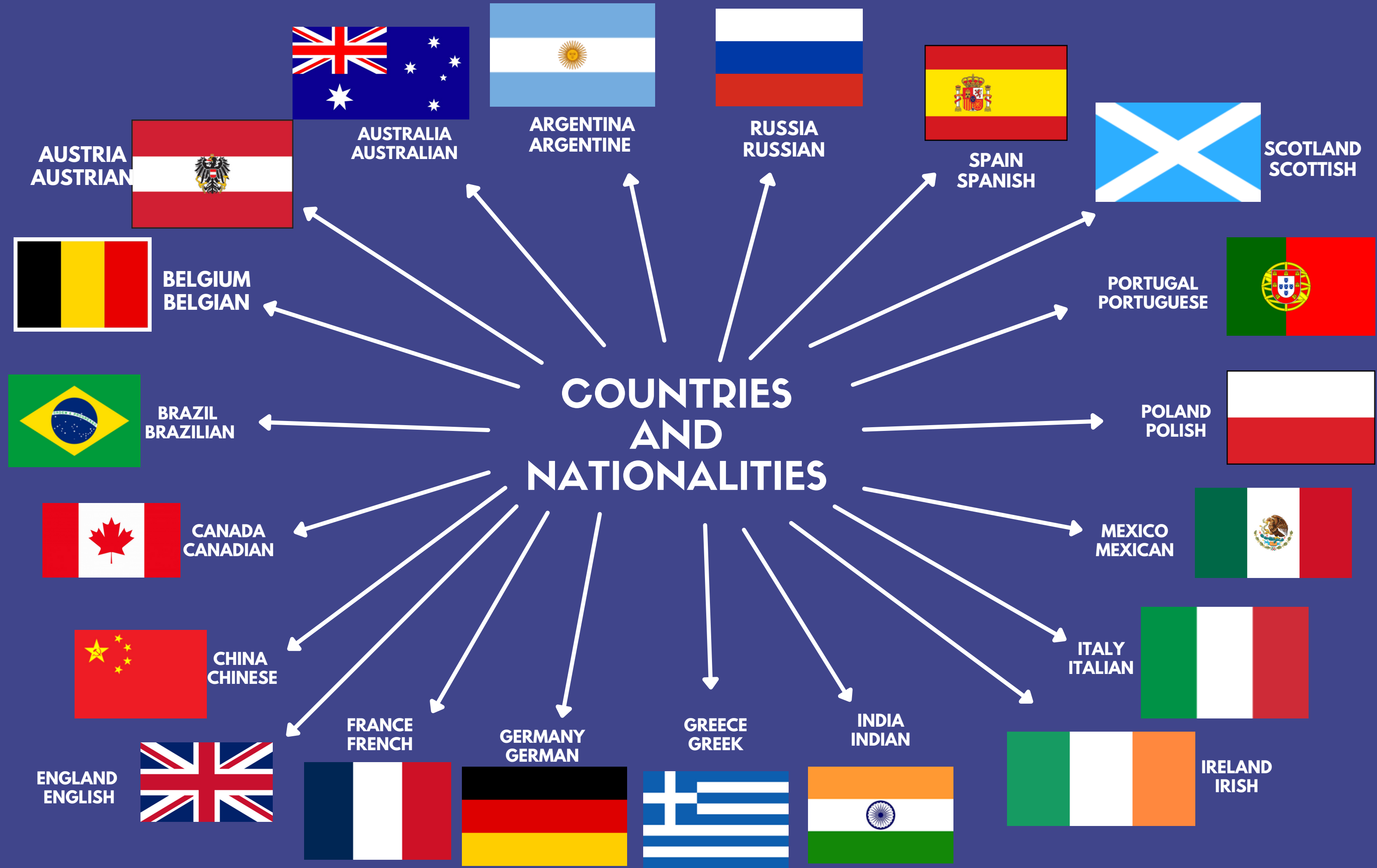


MIND MAP
