

- That is my father, the tall man that is preparing burgers.
  - These are my shoes; I bought them last week.
- Those are earrings I got for my wife. Our anniversary is next week!
- Those are my dogs, the ones that are playing with the children.

These pronouns are used when someone wants to refer to a specific object in a sentence. These pronouns are related to the place of one or more objects, and the distance in which they are.

The pronoun "this" can be used to refer to a single object, as long as it is close.

The pronoun "that" can also be used to refer to a single object. The difference is that that object is far from the person who is referencing it. It is important not to confuse this pronoun with the conjunction "that" whose meaning is "that".

As in the other pronouns, we also have plurals.

The pronoun "these" has the same function as the pronoun "this", only it is used to refer to two or more objects.

And last but also important, you have the pronoun "those". Like the pronoun "that", it refers to two or more objects that are far away.
