

## Comparatives and adjectives

COMPATIVE. When comparing two things, you're likely to utilice adjectives like smaller, bigger, taller, more interesting, and less expensive. A mistake that both native speakers and non-native speakers make is using incorrectly formed comparative adjectives. ADJECTIVES. When comparing more than two things, you'll likely utilice words and phrases like smallest, biggest, tallest, most interesting, and least interesting. Make sure you utilice the proper ending or superlative adjective when forming these superlatives.


