Comparative sentences using adjectives

sentences using comparatives with short adjectives

1. Sofía is smaller than Cecilia.
2. Raul is shorter than Peter.
3. They are noisier than your friends.
4. Today is colder than yesterday.
5. China is bigger than Italy.
6. She is younger than her brother.
7. He is older than his friend.
8. My car is newer than yours.
9. His house is bigger than mine.
10. I am taller than my brothers.

Comparatives in English are used to differentiate between two objects that may or may not be nouns.

- ✚ *When adjectives or adverbs are short, the ending -er is used, then than is written.*
- ✚ *More is used when adjectives or adverbs are more than two syllables, it is also written than after the adjective or adverb.*

1. Do you love me? Yes, i do.

Interrogative sentences using do and does

Do and does are used in the English language as auxiliary verbs to form questions in the present simple.

- Do is used with the first and third person pronouns: (I), (you), (we), (they).
- Does is used with the pronouns of the second person singular: (he), (she), (it).

Sentences with does

1. Does she sing opera? Yes, she does.
2. Does he always walk so quickly? Yes, he does.
3. Does this dog eat a lot? No, It doesn't.
4. Does she work for your father? No, she doesn't.
5. Does he like your new car? No, he doesn't.
6. Does she dance salsa? Yes, she dances salsa
7. Does Peter teach literature? No, he doesn't teach literature.
8. Does the cat like to be on the tree? Yes, It likes to be on the tree
9. Does she like chocolate? Yes she does
10. Does he play the piano? No, he doesn't
