



Verb to be (singular)

AFFIRMATIVE (+)

I'm (= I am)	I`m British.
you`re (= you are)	You`re a student.
he's (=he is)	He`s German.
she`s (= she is)	She`s Brazilian.
it`s(= it is)	It's American.

We use it for a thing (a car, a book, etc.) Example: a German car, an English book.

NEGATIVE (-)

I'm not (= I am not)	I'm not American.
you aren't (= are not)	You aren't a teacher.
he isn't (= is not)	He isn't from Berlin.
she isn't (= is not)	She isn't Australian.
it isn't (= is not)	It isn't a Mercedes.

TIPS: We can also say "you`re not", "he`s not". and "it`s not". Example; you`re not a teacher.


