





GRAMMAR Verb to be (singular)

AFFIRMATIVE (+)

I'm (= 1 am)	I`m British.
you're (= you are)	You're a student.
he's (=he is)	He's German.
she's (= she is)	She's Brazilian.
it`s(= it is)	It's American.

We use it for a thing (a car, a book, etc.) Example: a German car, an English book.

NEGATIVE (-)

I'm not (= I am not)	I'm not American.
you aren't (= are not)	You aren't a teacher.
he isn't (= is not)	He isn't from Berlin.
she isn't (= is not)	She isn't Australian.
it isn't (= is not)	It isn't a Mercedes.

TIPS: We can also say "you're not", "he's not".

and "it's not".


Example: you're not a teacher.

TIPS: We can also say: "No, you're not". "No, he's not". "No, she's not" and "No, it's not". We can't say "Yes, you're", "Yes, I'm", "Yes, he's".




