### Present continuous statements; conjunctions

I'm	I'm not	OR:
You're	You're not	You aren't
She's wearing shoes.	She's not	She isn't wearing boots.
We're	We're not	We aren't
They're	They're not	They aren't
It's snowing.	It's not	It isn't raining.

#### Conjunctions

It's snowing,  
**and** it's windy.  
It's sunny,  
**but** it's cold.  
It's windy,  
**so** it's very cold.

## 2 Present continuous statements; conjunctions

- ▶ The present continuous is the present of *be* + verb + *-ing*: **It's raining.**  
**She's wearing shoes.**
- ▶ The two negative contractions mean the same: **He's not/He isn't** wearing a coat. **We're not/We aren't** wearing gloves.

## 2 Present continuous Wh-questions

- ▶ Use the present continuous to talk about actions that are happening right now: What **are** you **doing**? I'm **talking** to you!
- ▶ In questions, the *be* verb comes before the subject: What **are** you doing?
- ▶ To form the continuous of verbs ending in *-e*, drop the *e* and add *-ing*:  
have → having.
- ▶ For verbs ending in vowel + consonant, double the consonant and add *-ing*:  
get → getting.

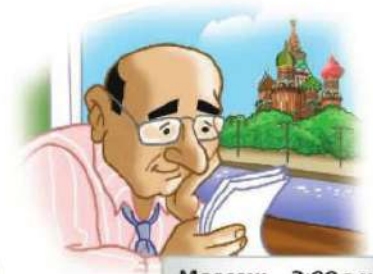

**3 Present continuous yes/no questions; adjective**

- ▶ In questions, the present continuous is *be* + subject + **verb-ing**.
- ▶ **Are you wearing** brown shoes?
- ▶ Adjectives can come before nouns or after the verb.
- ▶ His hat **is blue**.
- ▶ Adjectives don't have a plural form: a **green hat**, not **green hats**.

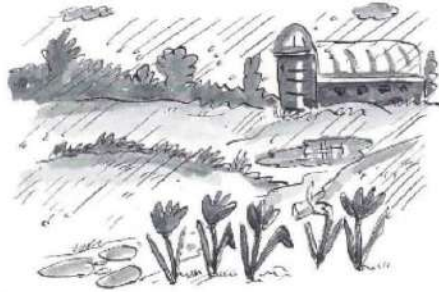

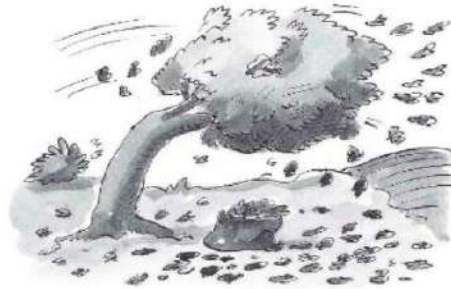
