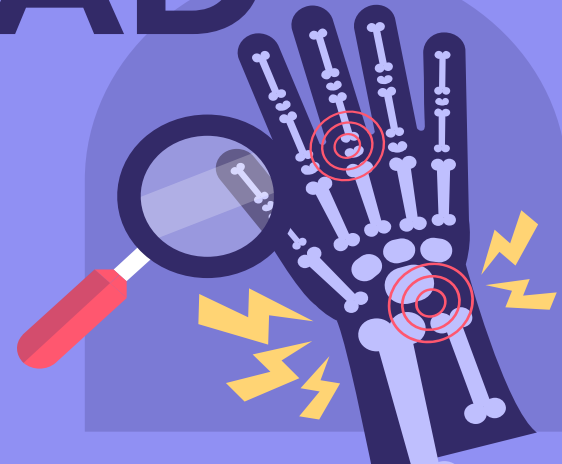

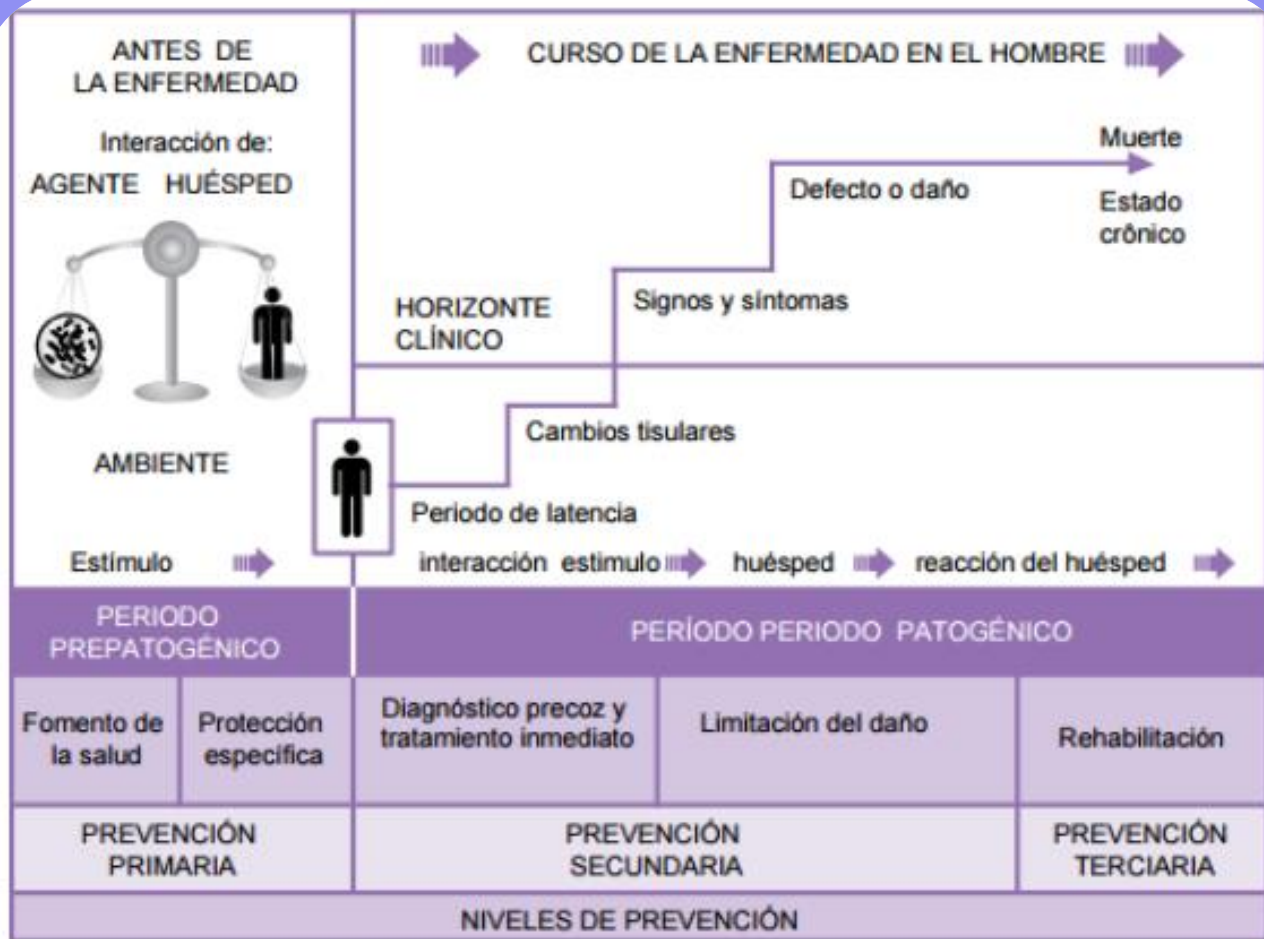
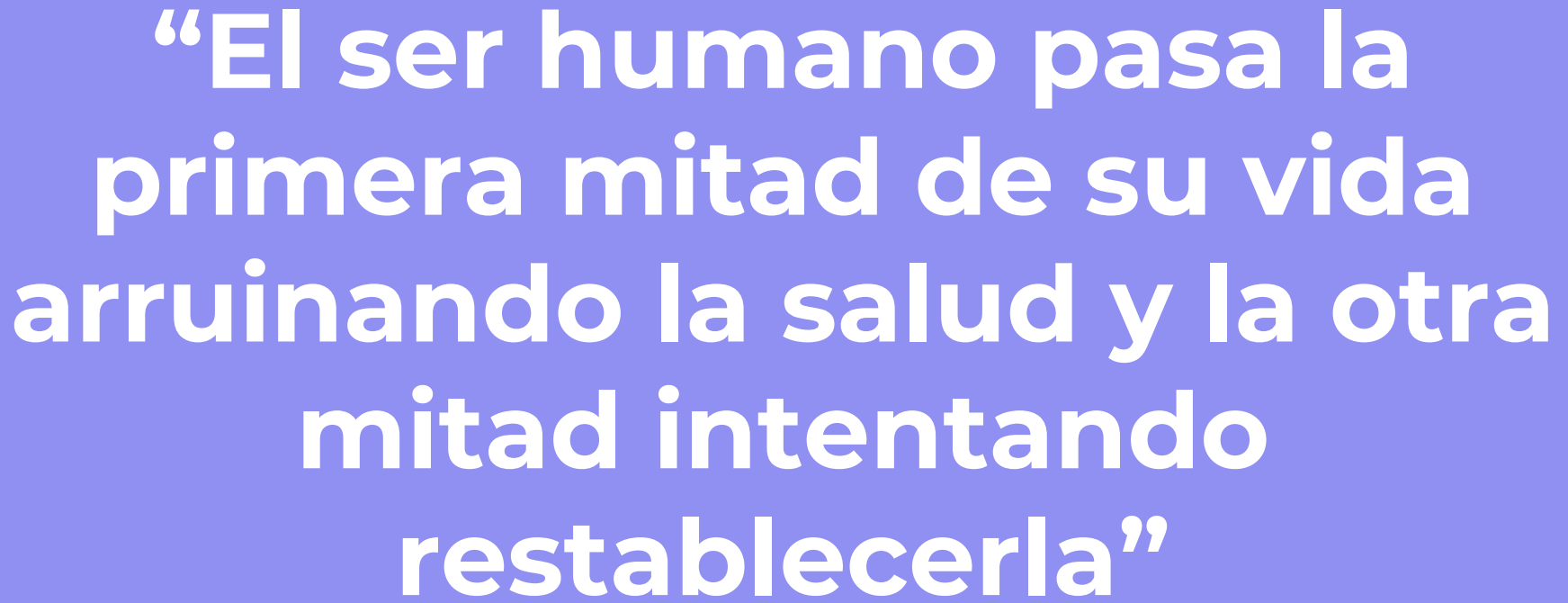


Figura 3 Historia natural de la enfermedad. Fuente: (OMS/OPS, 2011)

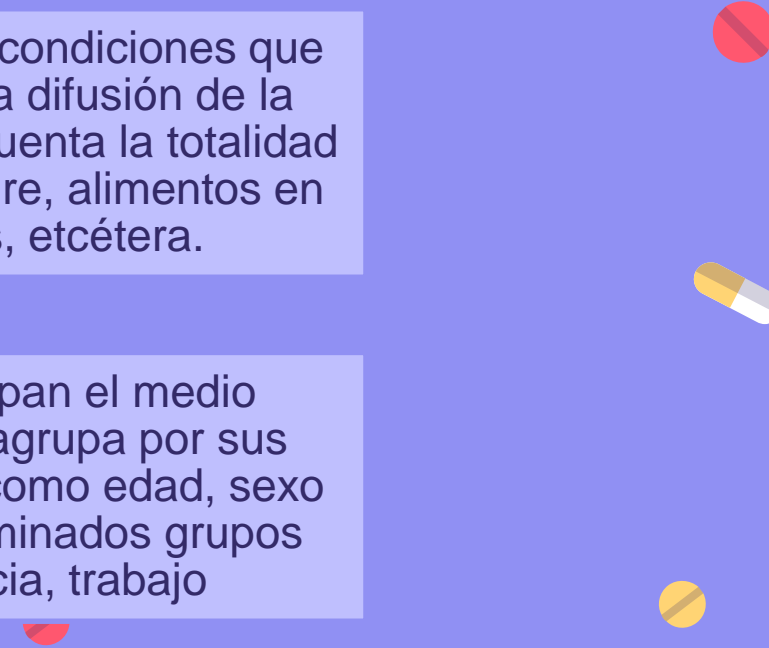

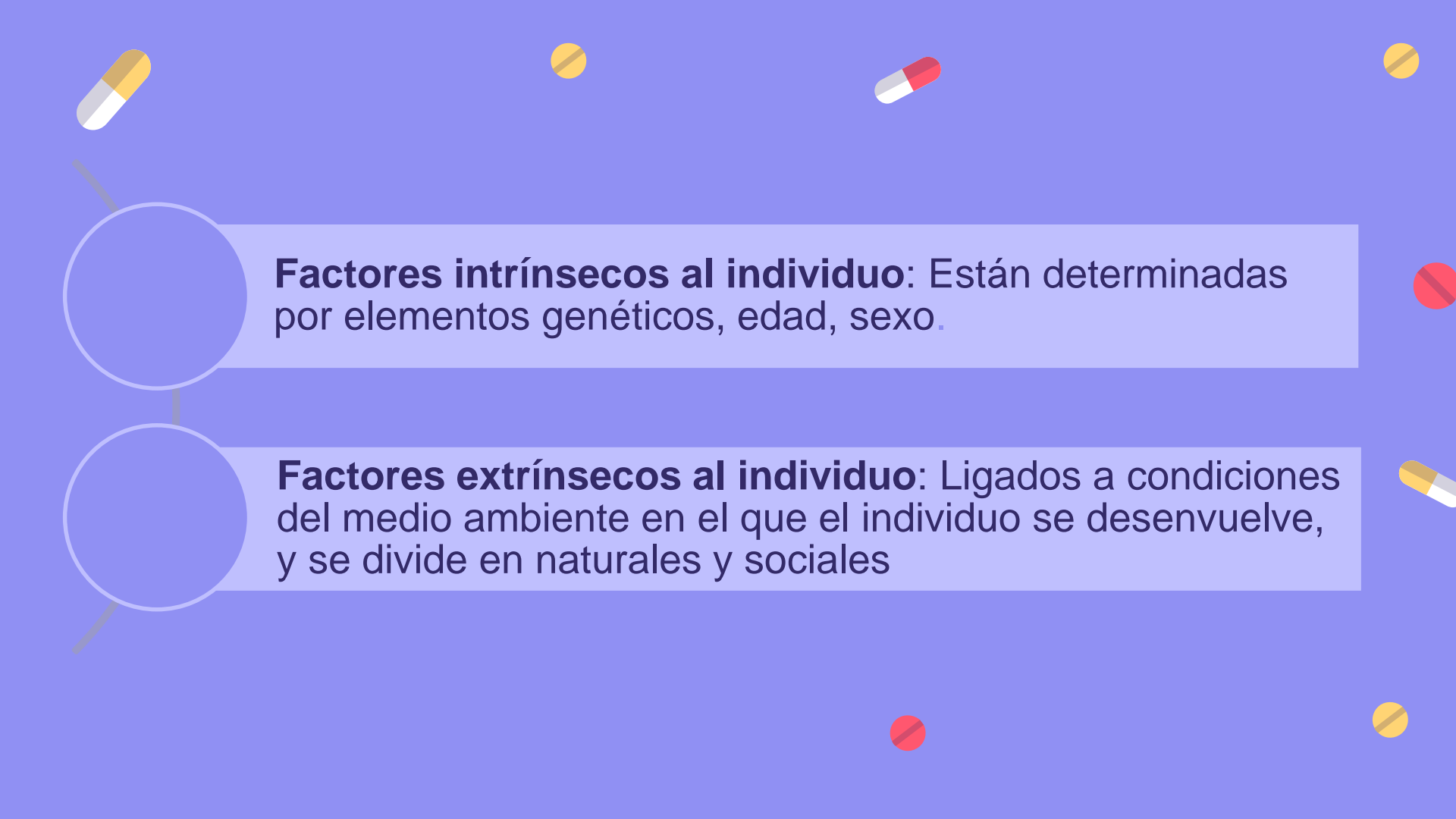
Enfoque conceptual

La modificación o desequilibrio de algunos de los componentes de la triada, ocasiona la enfermedad



La salud es la homeostasis (equilibrio) entre el agente, huésped y ambiente.

Objetivo

Evitar la progresión



Acciones dirigidas a:

- Tienen por objeto interrumpir la progresión de la enfermedad desde un estadio temprano, no reconocido, hasta uno más severo.

- Diagnóstico precoz y tratamiento temprano.

- Búsqueda activa de casos Tamizajes en población

Objetivos:

- Curar y prevenir el proceso de la enfermedad
- Evitar la propagación de la enfermedades transmisibles
- Prevenir las secuelas
- Disminuir el periodo de incapacidad.
