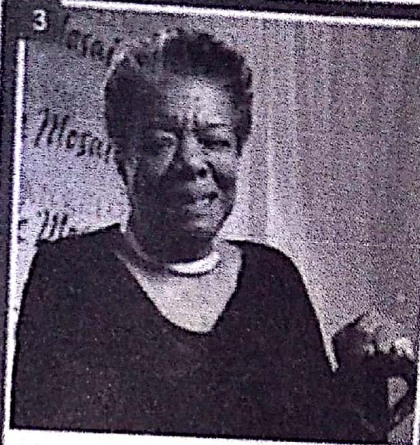
Marie Curie, scientist (1867-1934)

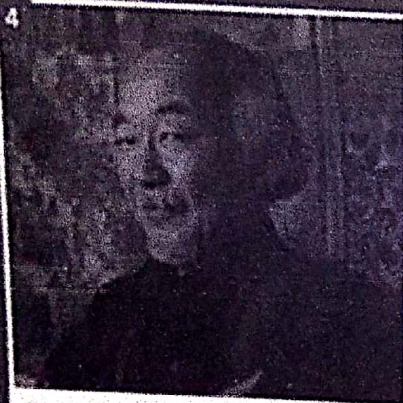
Gabriel Garcia Márquez, author (1927-2014)

- wrote *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings*, 1969



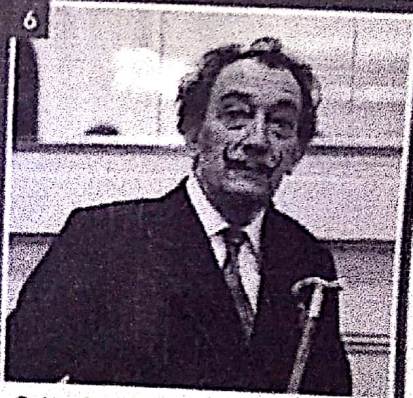
Pat Morita, actor (1932-2005)

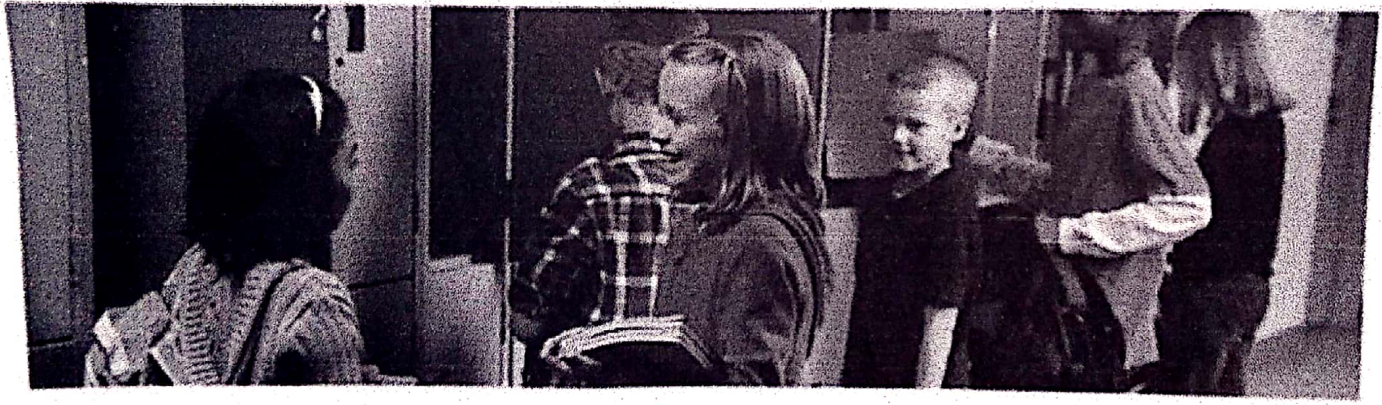
