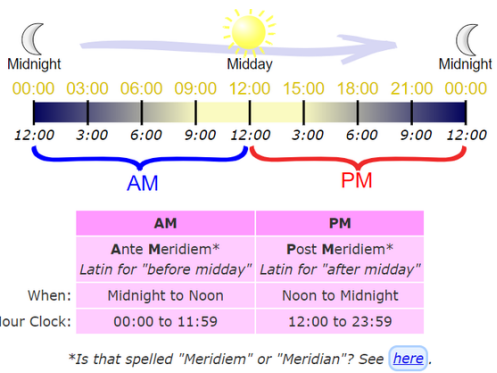
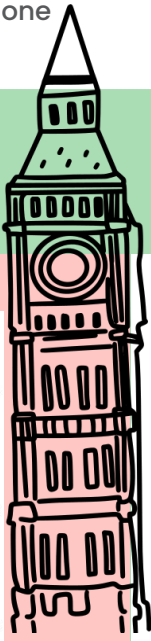
WHAT TIME IS IT?
