### **NOTE:**

In the third singular the verb always, end is -s:

He wants, she needs, he gives, she thinks. Negative and question forms use DOES (= the third person of the auxiliary DO') THE infinitive of the verbs. VERBS ENDING IN -Y : THE THIRD PERSON CHANGES THE -Y TO-IES: fly> flies, CRY> CRIES . EXEPTION : IF THERE IS AVOWEL BOFORE THE -Y: PLAY> PLAYS, PRAY > PRAYS.
