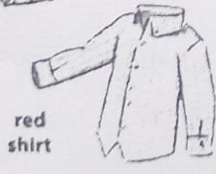
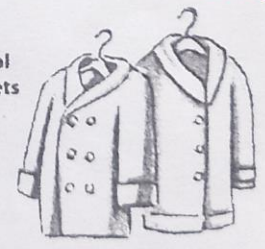
1. A: These cotton gloves are nice.

 B: Yes, but the wool ones are warmer. (warm)

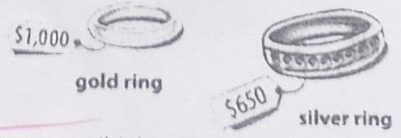


3. A: This purple shirt is an interesting color!
