## AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES

The present progressive (composed of the verb be and the gerund that is formed by adding -ing to the end of the verb) is used to express an action in progress, in progress or unfinished

- I am sleeping
- You are taking milk with sugar
- Jade is studying English
- Mateo is reading a book
- The dog is playing with the ball
- We are meeting in the park
- You are running in the football field
- They are fixing the home
- Saori are watching the cell phone
- My aunt are buying pantry in the market



## NEGATIVE SENTENCES

The present continuous is used, in the negative form, to deny situations that are occurring during the moment of speaking. When we use the present continuous negative, we start with the subject followed by the verb to be and not and the verb ending in -ing.

- Camilla isn't composing a song.
- They aren't dancing in the park.
- Maria, Lupita and Carmen aren't planning party
- Carlos isn't looking the sky
- The store isn't open at 8:00 am
- We are not stealing money
- Jose and Roman aren't touching the Guit;
- They aren't talking Spanish
- The girls aren't skiing in the snow
- My cousin isn't walking alone



## INTERROGATIVE SENTENCE

It is used to ask about situations that are during happening the moment of speaking. When the present. use continuous interrogative, we start with the verb to be followed by the subject and the verb ending in -ing.

- Is Fernanda apologising with your mother? Yes. She is
- Are Luis and Carlos arrested by steal? No, they aren't
- Is the store opening at 8:00 am? No, It isn't
- Is Mario building a home? Yes, He is
- Is karina cleaning the window? No,she isn't
- Are they composing a song? Yes, They are
- Are Pedro and Roman touching guitar? No, they aren't
- Are the dog playing with the bough? No. It isn't
- Is marisol dancing choreography of hip hop? Yes, She is
- Are you eating fried chicken? Yes, I Am
