Rule No. 1  
All verbs must end in -ing

Rule No. 2  
When a verb has a single syllable or whose stress falls on the last syllable and ends in a consonant, the latter must be duplicated and the -ing will be added.

Rule No. 3  
For verbs ending in an -e that is not pronounced, this must be replaced with -ing.

Rule No. 4  
When the verb ends with -ee, only -ing should be added.

Rule No. 5  
When a verb ends in -ie, these letters must be replaced with -y and -ing added
