NEGATIVE AUXILIARY IN PAST TENSE.

WHAT IS IT?

The simple past tense in English is a "verb tense" used to talk about actions that took place in the past and have already ended.



TYPES OF VERBS FOR THEIR SIMPLE PAST:

For this, we indicate the subject of the action, followed by the verb in the past, and we add the complement. In this case it is necessary to take into account if the verb that indicates the action is regular or irregular.

If the verb is regular, the past tense is formed by adding the ending -d -ed to the end of the word depending on whether it ends in a vowel or a consonant, respectively. As an additional rule, if the word ends in and this consonant is changed to the ending -ied.
If the verb is irregular, you must use the appropriate conjugation in each case, since it varies for each word.



STRUCTURE IN NEGATIVE:

To form negative sentences we use the auxiliary verb to do in the past tense, on which the negation falls (did not, or didn't in short). The structure is then configured as follows:

Subject + not (not) + verb + complement

EXAMPLES:

1. I didn't play soccer yesterday.
2. He didn't eat pizza last night.
3. I didn't swim in the pool yesterday
4. I didn't bathe last night
5. I didn't play basketball yesterday
6. I didn't eat fruit last night
7. I didn't play tennis yesterday
8. I didn't eat bread last night
9. yesterday I did not run in the field
10. I didn't drink water last night
11. I didn't play bolleyball yesterday
12. I didn't eat vegetables last night
13. I didn't play karate yesterday
14. I didn't eat soup last night
15. I didn't play marbles yesterday
16. I didn't drink tea last night
