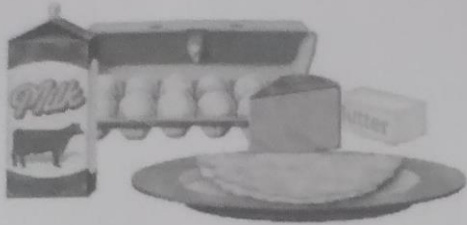
1. A: What do you want for dinner?

 B: I always have some juice and coffee. I don't put any sugar in my coffee, but I like some milk in it.

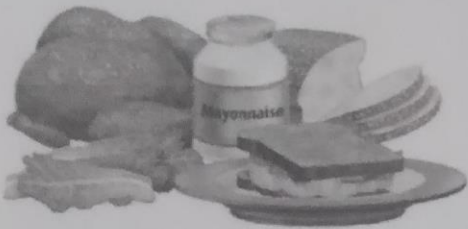

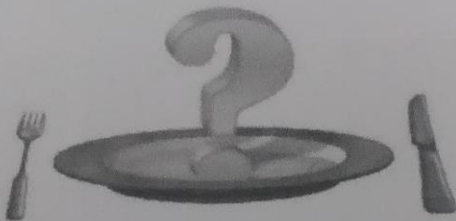
