 Yes. Let's get **some** (eggs).
 No. We don't need **any** (eggs).

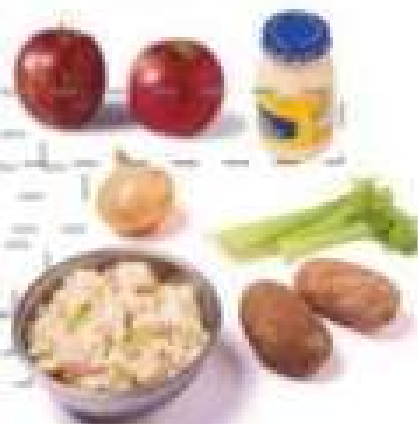
Noncount nouns

Do we need **any** bread?
 Yes. Let's get **some** (bread).
 No. We don't need **any** (bread).
