 B: Yeah, but let's get any bread. And some cheese, too.

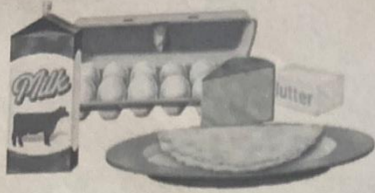
